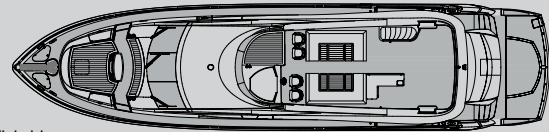

The saloon deck provides a large open plan dining and seating area, which opens up into a sizeable aft cockpit. This area can be laid for alfresco dining or simply be used as a comfortable seating area. The large, spacious flybridge provides a second arena for entertaining guests.

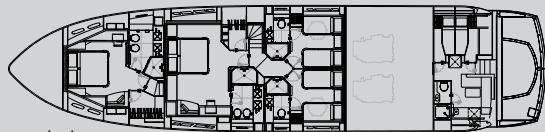

In Spring 2010, the Savoy will unveil the culmination of a two year, £100 million restoration – the most ambitious and eagerly anticipated hotel refurbishment in British history. Paying homage to its original Edwardian and Art Deco design, the project encompasses the entire building from the courtyard and famed American Bar to the public areas and 268 guestrooms.

The programme heralds a number of notable highlights including the addition of a luxurious new two bedroom Royal Suite, the complete remodel of the legendary River Restaurant and the relaunch of the 20 River Suites with their iconic views over the River Thames. In addition, The Savoy Grill will return again under the supervision of Gordon Ramsay.

New to the hotel will be the Beaufort Bar and Savoy Tea, the first an opulent new venue to enjoy champagne and cocktails and the latter, a bijou teashop.

Charters will depart from Savoy Pier, just steps from the hotel, and guests will be able to choose from different trips including culinary cruises with the Savoy's chefs on board and luxury transfers to the O2. The Savoy is also ideally placed for drinks, dinners or accommodation before and after charters.



PORTSMOUTH, COWES & BEAULIEU

- 09.30** Guests arrive in Ocean Village, Southampton, and are greeted by the Captain.

- 09.35** Upon boarding, you will be served with tea, coffee and Danish pastries. You will be introduced to the crew and will have the opportunity to view the vessel's opulent interior.

- 10.00** Your Captain will give a safety briefing and lifejacket demonstration.

- 10.15** The motoryacht will depart for a tour of the Eastern Solent, taking in the Napoleonic Forts and the Historic Naval Shipyard at Portsmouth. There will be a 'champagne moment' before heading to the Isle of Wight for lunch.

- 12.30** 'High Energy' will berth in Cowes Yacht Haven, home to the world's largest international sailing regatta, Cowes Week. Enjoy Pimms on the flybridge before being taken ashore to the Royal Corinthian Yacht Club. A delicious lunch will be served in the 'Captain's Room' – a private dining room with views over the Solent.

- 14.30** If time permits, guests will have the opportunity to have a look round Cowes and its unique selection of shops.

- 15.00** The motoryacht will depart Cowes and head across the Solent to Beaulieu River. Cruising along this peaceful river, guests can take in the beautiful views.

- 16.30** 'High Energy' will return to its berth in Ocean Village. Afternoon tea will be served.

- 17.00** Guests depart.

YARMOUTH, ALUM BAY, THE NEEDLES & LYMINGTON

- 09.30** Guests arrive in Southampton's Ocean Village Marina, are greeted by the Captain and shown to 'High Energy'.

- 09.35** Having welcomed you on board, the Crew will offer you tea, coffee and Danish pastries. The Captain will explain the itinerary for the day and give a safety briefing.

- 10.15** The motoryacht will head out of Southampton Water and west towards Hurst Castle.

- 11.30** Passing Hurst Castle, 'High Energy' will continue to the Needles and drop anchor in Alum Bay, which is famous for its coloured sands. Champagne and nibbles will be served.

- 12.30** Having weighed anchor, 'High Energy' will head into the quaint harbour of Yarmouth on the Isle of Wight. Guests will be taken ashore to a restaurant for a delicious lunch.

- 14.30** The motoryacht will depart Yarmouth and head across the Solent to the renowned sailing town of Lyminster. A short cruise along the picturesque channel towards Lyminster town quay will offer views of many different craft.

- 15.15** 'High Energy' will begin its journey back through the Western Solent and into Southampton Water.

- 16.30** Having returned to Ocean Village, afternoon tea will be served on the aft deck.

- 17.00** Guests depart.

WEST COUNTRY & SCILLY ISLES TEN DAY ITINERARY

- Day 1** Guests are welcomed on board 'High Energy' in Southampton's Ocean Village Marina. The motoryacht will cruise out of Southampton Water and through the Western Solent. Leaving the Needles behind, the journey from here will take a couple of hours to Weymouth, tonight's destination.
- Day 2** After breakfast, 'High Energy' will head out of Weymouth and round Portland Bill. From Portland, the motoryacht will cruise west across Lyme Bay towards the 'English Riviera' town of Torquay. You may be lucky enough to see a pod of dolphins en route. This afternoon you will be able to look round the town at your leisure or visit one of the nine neighbouring beaches.
- Day 3** A short trip across Torbay is the town of Brixham. 'High Energy' will anchor here and a water taxi will take you ashore for lunch. Later, having returned to the motoryacht, you will cruise south west along the coast and into Salcombe harbour where you will be moored tonight. You will have the opportunity to explore Salcombe's narrow streets and unique shops by foot, or explore the estuary by tender.
- Day 4** From Salcombe, your journey today will take you further west to the natural harbour of Falmouth in Cornwall. Falmouth is known for its excellent sandy beaches, and you will have the opportunity this afternoon to experience these for yourself.
- Day 5** A journey of about 60 miles from Falmouth takes you to the Scilly Isles – your next destination. A combination of white sand beaches and beautiful natural landscapes, this archipelago offers a wonderful escape which is best explored by water. To make the most of this magical place, 'High Energy' is scheduled to stay here for two nights. She will anchor off St Mary's – one of the five inhabited islands.

- Day 6** With over 50 islands in the archipelago there is plenty more to explore today, with the possibility of seeing wildlife such as seals and puffins. Lunch can be taken ashore – enjoy a picnic on one of the uninhabited islands or go to one of the local eateries. Tonight will be spent at anchor off St Mary's.
- Day 7** 'High Energy' will depart the Scilly Islands at first light to begin the five to six hour cruise to Plymouth. Before reaching Plymouth, the vessel will anchor in Fowey and lunch will be served. Later, 'High Energy' will head into Plymouth where it will be berthed for the night.
- Day 8** After breakfast, 'High Energy' will depart Plymouth and head along the coast. Passing Salcombe, 'High Energy' will enter the Dart's estuary and cruise gently upstream. Anchoring off Dartmouth, a water taxi will take you ashore for lunch. Having enjoyed the afternoon ashore in this attractive town, you will cruise round to Torquay to spend the night.
- Day 9** Another early start will see 'High Energy' reach Studland Bay in time to drop anchor for lunch. Located just outside Poole Harbour, this bay boasts a National Trust beach and tranquil waters in prevailing winds. The afternoon can be spent at leisure in this idyllic location before taking a slow cruise into Poole Harbour. 'High Energy' will berth at Poole Quay tonight.
- Day 10** The journey of around two hours from Poole to Southampton will take in sights such as Hengistbury Head, Hurst Castle and the Needles. 'High Energy' will return to its home berth in Ocean Village in Southampton where the charter will end.



SOUTHAMPTON, CHANNEL ISLES & ST MALO TEN DAY SAMPLE ITINERARY

- Day 1** Guests will be welcomed on board 'High Energy' in Southampton's Ocean Village Marina. The vessel will head to Cowes for lunch at a restaurant ashore. Later, 'High Energy' will cruise to the small Isle of Wight harbour of Yarmouth where it will berth overnight.
- Day 2** Making an early start, the motoryacht will cruise out of the Solent and head south across the English Channel towards the Channel Islands. 'High Energy' will be moored up in St Peter Port on the island of Guernsey in time for lunch. The afternoon can be spent at leisure exploring this pretty town.
- Day 3** Today's cruise will take you on a tour of the small yet pretty island of Sark, which is about half an hour's cruise from Guernsey. Said to have some of the most dramatic coastline in the Channel Islands, this is the perfect location to anchor and have lunch. With no cars on the island, this is a peaceful and enchanting place. 'High Energy' will return to St Peter Port to enjoy the evening ashore.
- Day 4** You will motor out of St Peter Port to Fermain Bay for a relaxing breakfast at anchor. The motoryacht will then take you across the Little Russel channel to Herm Island. Anchoring in Belvoir Bay, you will be taken ashore by tender to enjoy the beach and perhaps a cliff-top walk before lunch at the island's hotel. Later, re-board 'High Energy' and return to St Peter Port for the night.
- Day 5** A journey of about an hour will take you to Jersey, the largest of the Channel Islands. Berthing in St Helier, you will have the opportunity to spend the afternoon exploring the town. Tonight, 'High Energy' will remain in St Helier, giving you the chance to sample one of the town's restaurants.

- Day 6** Today's cruise will take you further south and into France. The walled town of St Malo is about two hours from St Helier and well worth exploring. Berthing here for two nights, you will have ample opportunity to explore the attractive streets, bars, restaurants and shops, as well as the neighbouring beaches.
- Day 7** Spend today at leisure in St Malo enjoying the delicious cuisine and the attractive beaches.
- Day 8** This morning can be spent relaxing or shopping in St Malo. Enjoy lunch ashore before the journey northwards to Jersey. Tonight, St Helier will provide the overnight berth and evening's entertainment.
- Day 9** Departing St Helier this morning, today's cruise will take you past Sark. Enjoy a leisurely lunch at anchor in one of Sark's beautiful bays. This afternoon, 'High Energy' will continue the journey north to the island of Alderney. The third largest of the Channel Islands, Alderney remains largely unspoilt, with cliffs, gorseland, white sand beaches and narrow cobbled streets. Tonight you will stay at anchor in Braye Harbour. Catch the water taxi ashore to visit one of the restaurants.
- Day 10** Heading north, today 'High Energy' will cross the English Channel back to the UK mainland. Arriving into Ocean Village after a journey of around four hours, the crew will bid guests a fond farewell.



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
